## President's Message



February is a big month for Burleith and our neighbors. On February 9th at 6:30pm, the Zoning Commission will hold a special meeting to

publicly decide the **outcome of the Georgetown University 2010 Campus Plan**. Under D.C. administrative regulations, the Zoning Commission must deliberate and then vote on the case in a public forum. So even though the hearing portion of the case is over, I still encourage all residents of Burleith to attend the meeting to show their support.

I say it is a big month because the Georgetown University Campus Plan has been the dominant story in the community for well over a year, and now we are days away from some form of resolution. What will that resolution look like? And what happens after next Thursday? Simply put, I do not know. There are a number of possible outcomes, and I would be foolish to make any predictions. But you can be sure that any improvements to the Plan since 2010 were largely due to the efforts of concerned citizens in Burleith, Georgetown, and Foxhall, and our elected representatives in Advisory Neighborhood Commission 2E and

Advisory Neighborhood Commission 3D. Looking to the future, it is my hope that we can all move forward as a community, find more constructive and positive ways of addressing legitimate concerns, and ultimately, avoid a repeat performance in 2020.

On other matters, in December, our Advisory Neighborhood Commission endorsed the initial phase of the **Glover Park Improvement Project**. The project contemplates streetscape improvements in the Glover Park commercial district and some restrictions on traffic lanes on Wisconsin Avenue. Obviously, there are some concerns about the potential for overflow traffic from Wisconsin Avenue using cut-through streets in Burleith. We have expressed these concerns, and both the Advisory Neighborhood Commission and the District Department of Transportation will be monitoring the effects as the project develops. The project is planned to begin in March 2012 and be completed in the fall.

In light of concerns regarding power outages, the Board, through our commissioner, Ed Solomon, recently requested a representative from **Pepco** attend the January 30th ANC public meeting to answer questions regarding the reliability of service in our neighborhood. We all agree there

are some unanswered questions relating to Pepco's performance and this will be an opportunity to ask those questions. Additionally, the Board sent a letter of support to the D.C. Office of People's Council objecting to Pepco's proposed rate hikes without accompanying quality assurances. We will continue to press Pepco and our representatives on these issues.

The Washington Post recently ran a story highlighting the rise in **thefts of packages** delivered to homes. This story reinforces some of the emails I have seen on our community listserv describing stolen packages. Apparently, this is becoming more common, so please take precautions and report stolen packages to MPD. And a big thanks to our neighbors who secure those packages when we are not home!

And last, on a completely different note, please come to **Burleith Winter Gløgg Party!** All are welcome, so come meet your neighbors and drink a glass (mug?) of Gløgg. I hope to see you there!

Requests for transport to doctors, physical therapists and dentists were filled, and volunteers also offered rides to Village functions, shopping and other errands.

Service requests by Village members included computer help, visits with members who are house-bound, changing smoke alarm batteries, shoveling snow, weeding, and organizing kitchen cabinets! A very sound beginning for the Georgetown Village!

The Village is in the process of building a referral list of suggested vendors who would give a discount to members.

The regular activities for Village members include a weekly "Coffee with Lynn" at St. John's rectory; and a monthly member-sponsored coffee at a member's home. Twice monthly members enjoy a Happy Hour at the Daily Grill. There is an active book club, and a Classic Literature group is in the planning stages. A trip to the Philadelphia Flower Show is on the March calendar.

Members enjoyed a docent led tour of the Building Museum in January, and are looking forward to a similar tour of the Corcoran Gallery in the near future.

## GARDENING IN BURLEITH

I'm writing this column with my fingers crossed that our winter is still comparatively balmy at the time you read this article...and yes, I am aware that it's been a miserable January for you avid skiers. But a mild winter lets this aspiring garden columnist actually find something to write about in February!

I was outdoors yesterday in 54-degree weather, pattering in the moist soil and experiencing absolute delight while doing things which would be considered "chores" in May. So I will encourage you to do the same, should you find the felicitous coincidence of a warmer day and an hour's free time. Unfortunately, spring weeds like chickweed don't seem to carry calendars, so they spring up and grow enthusiastically during warm snaps in the winter. Hasn't anybody told these guys that the rest of nature is hibernating right now? Just as spring begins and we humans again open our eyes to nature, winter weeds are already flowering and are flinging seeds far and wide. The gardening battle is lost before we've even begun to fight.

I am out to stop this dastardly plot! Now, weeding is not fun if you put it up against going down to the Tidal Basin

to see the cherry blossoms in March. But you'd be amazed how pleasant it is to get your hands in the dirt on those occasional warm days in January or February. It is just a marvelous break from huddling indoors. And you will be way, way ahead of the game when spring actually gets here. ## Pepco Warns Customers about Prepaid "Green Dot" Credit Card Scam

*Pepco Security Contacts US Secret Service and FBI about Fake Billing Claims*

WASHINGTON, D.C. – Pepco is warning its customers about a scam involving prepaid "Green Dot" Visa credit cards. Callers claiming to represent Pepco are contacting customers telling them their electric service is scheduled to be shut off and they should make a payment by purchasing a "Green Dot" VISA card. Customers are then asked to call another phone number where information is obtained from the credit card and the monetary value is removed from the "Green Dot" VISA card.

Pepco Corporate Security reports that 22 customers have called to notify the company of this "suspicious" and unauthorized contact with its customers.

"Since this activity involves phone (wire) and electronic commerce we have already contacted the United States Secret Service and FBI to provide information we have regarding this scam against our customers" said Thomas Graham, President Pepco Region. "We are very concerned about the impact this fraud may have on our customers. Although the Pepco name is being used, we have no involvement in this scam."

Pepco advises customers that Customer Service Representatives will always be able to provide the name on the account, the account address, and the exact past due balance. If the caller cannot provide that information, it is very likely the call is not from a Pepco employee. In this case, customers should not provide any type of payment or financial information. They should call Pepco Customer

Service immediately at 202-833-7500 and also call local law enforcement to report the incident.
